SENIOR PASTOR REPORT ANNUAL REPORT 2020-2021

Not all church years are created equally. 2020 to 2021 was the hardest year of Calvary's history, at least that all of us can remember. Political turmoil, civil unrest, and a global pandemic all weighed heavily on our lives. The global shutdown in response to COVID-19 propelled our church to improvise on the fly for the entire year. We began by immediately producing online services each week. By summer 2020, we were holding in person on-lawn services. In the fall, because of a surge in COVID cases, we initiated our home-church strategy. More than 1,000 people signed up to meet together for church in homes; relationships blossomed, prayer and caring increased, and our church continued to grow. By January 2021 we began a safe and simple regathering plan.

During the global pandemic, our members continued to generously support Calvary with prayer, encouragement, and financial giving. Staff and volunteers regularly connected with all our attenders. We launched weekly video updates for spiritual encouragement. Oh, and we opened our third campus in Thornton! God has been so gracious to us in a hard year. He's always working — even the gates of hell will not prevail against His church.

Today, we're making our way back to a different kind of ministry that is somewhat simpler. Our mission is the same, although it seems even more urgent. Our world is broken, lonely, and longing for stability. Only the unchanging Lord Jesus Christ is the hope of our world. It is our privilege to proclaim His gospel and fulfill His great command: To love Him with all our hearts and to love others with His grace and mercy. The opportunities have never been greater.

I want to thank our amazing staff who have prevailed through the last year of challenge. And all of the members and friends of Calvary who have stayed with us — if from a distance. God's work is not done. Our best days are ahead!

Calvary Connections

We help people develop relationships in groups, meet new friends, and create warm group environments on Sunday and throughout the week. Guests are encouraged towards deeper involvement with Calvary. Dozens of people took the first steps to join us at Calvary and grew through Starting Point gatherings, HomeGroups, and membership classes throughout the year. Over 70 people attended Starting Point across all three campuses.

Worship Services

This year in our worship services we studied the books of Acts and Philippians and key passages from John and Ephesians. We examined what it takes to follow Jesus in "Walk in the Way," "Knew Normal" helped us find hope and peace, "I AM" set our focus on Jesus, and "Battle Ready" addressed schemes Satan uses against us.

The online worship service we began last spring grew in its quality and impact. We gathered for worship on the lawns at all three campuses and in home groups. The reach of our ministry expanded beyond the communities of our physical campuses as people worshiped with us online all over the world. Our YouTube channel grew to nearly 700 subscribers as people watched, worshiped, and listened to the message during the week.





Children's Ministries

Calvary Kids values teaching the Bible creatively, being Christ-centered, engaging in worship and celebration, growing relationships, full family discipleship, and having fun while staying safe. Kids Quest became Calvary Kids in order to update our logo and vision, and for our children to feel a part of the greater Calvary Bible Church whole.

Calvary Kids Online kept our families and children connected. Backyard Kids Week saw families host groups in their own backyards. Over 200 children rejoined us in person when we regathered in January and 90 Calvary Kids leaders, both new and old, are serving with us on Sunday mornings, with more joining us every week.

Student Ministry

All three campuses have been working together to see students grow and mature in Christ and we are grateful for the ways God has worked over the last year in student ministry! Students opened the Bible in small groups, explored Biblical themes, and were challenged to walk with God and one another through a challenging season! Throughout this year, small group leaders have done an outstanding job leading students. This has been a blessing since we have heavily relied on their role during this season of constant change. We are thankful to have 100 volunteer leaders across our campuses who give their time, talents and energy to making disciples of our students at Calvary!

Middle School Ministry

Middle school students meet weekly for teaching, worship, and small group discussions. This spring over 115 students and volunteers from all three campuses gathered for a Winter WKND, a local retreat where students enjoyed worship, small groups and teaching about the role of the Holy Spirit in the life of God's people.

High School Ministry

High school students meet weekly for teaching, worship, and small group discussions. Over Spring Break, we hosted our Ironman Local Retreat with over 110 students and adult leaders from all three campuses. We gathered over four days to worship, engage in biblical teaching, practice spiritual disciplines, go on adventures, and be together in community!

HomeGroups

Amazing men and women led more than 60 online and in-person HomeGroups where over 1,000 people gathered for weekend worship, fellowship, and prayer. People came to faith in HomeGroups, baptisms took place, and neighbors were continually invited to participate. HomeGroups are still going strong! We marvel at all that God did in the past year through the people of Calvary.

Young Adults

The young adult groups at Calvary range from college-age to young families. This past year groups met for prayer, study, and fellowship. Along with meeting regularly throughout the week, young adults serve at the church. Calvary's young adults lead other groups and serve with Calvary Kids. The young adults bring vibrancy and life to Calvary

Adult Classes

Boulder, Erie, and Thornton offer adult classes encompassing a variety of topics. They focus on topic-specific classes that meet throughout the year.

Men's Ministry

We praise God for the opportunity men had to connect and grow at Calvary as Men's LifeGroups and Christian Leadership Concepts (CLC) groups continued to meet both virtually and in-person. Men of Action met tangible needs in our church family. New ministry opportunities began to launch in Thornton. We are excited to see how Jesus had continued to connect men to Calvary's mission at all three of our campuses.

Women's Ministry

With all the options that were made available in homes, online, and socially distanced at the church we saw an increase in women new to Calvary joining Bible studies, MOPS, and MOMSnext. Christmas brunches were held in Erie in small in-home groups and at the Thornton campus. Thursday afternoons were tea time on Zoom, an opportunity for connection, fun, and games. In March women from all three campuses gathered in Erie and online for the local women's retreat.

Local Outreach

The people of Calvary did a beautiful job this year of caring for our communities during a very challenging year. To care for those impacted by the pandemic, over 10,000 pounds of food and supplies were collected at seven different food drives across all three campuses. We also helped provide PPE and meals for healthcare workers. Individuals reached out to check on other Calvary members and their own neighbors often bringing them groceries, shoveling snow, or sharing notes of encouragement. We wrote over 600 personal notes of encouragement to the staff at nine schools in our communities. Throughout the year, we continued to partner with organizations like Boulder Homeless Shelter, EFAA, Erie Community Food Bank, Erie Uplink, Erie Solo Moms, Food for Hope, Habitat for Humanity, Harvest of Hope, Kids Hope USA, Boulder Pregnancy Resource Center, and Operation Christmas Child.

Through the Heart of Advent, Calvary came together to love, encourage, and support students, families, and schools hit hard by the pandemic. Over \$82,000 was raised for academic supports, learning interventions, and teacher encouragement. Funds provided for:

- Encouragement for school staff in the form of coffee and breakfast burritos!

Global Outreach

Calvary remains committed to supporting our global partners and seeing the Gospel go to the ends of the earth! This season has led to significant disruption for missionaries as many have been relocated, changed tactics, or have been in seasons of waiting for next steps. Following the blast in Beirut, Lebanon last August, Calvary sent funds to support our partner Horizons International as they are working on the ground in Beirut, Lebanon to show the love of Christ by providing for needs and sharing the Gospel. Calvary also supported Igreja Presbiteriana de Manaus (IPM), our partner church in Manaus, Brazil as they have been significantly affected by the current pandemic. Our partners continue to work to spread the Gospel, make disciples, translate the Scriptures, build up the Church, and reach some of the hardest to reach places in the world! We are committed to our partners and raising up future missionaries. We are eager to see the doors that God continues to open for the advancement of the gospel to every nation.

PEOPLE CALL THORNTON CAMPUS HOME

Thornton Campus

On April 14, 2020, after God led us to The Gathering Church, 11989 St. Paul Street in Thornton, Colorado, it became Calvary's third physical campus. Since that date, we have been working to refresh the property. The kids' rooms were reconfigured, the Worship Center was given a makeover with audio/visual upgrades, and the lobby was opened up to allow people to interact with one another before and after services. A core team of Calvary attendees from Boulder and Erie was formed to help launch the campus along with former members of The Gathering. In the midst of the pandemic, this team worked to make ministry happen at that campus in the same way it was happening in Boulder and Erie. There were lawn services and groups in the summer, and HomeGroups kicked off in the fall and pulled the community even closer together. In January, the first in-person services were held in the building.

Beyond this core team of volunteers, we hired a team of godly men and women to lead the campus and recently added a campus pastor, Zack Thompson, to that team.

Despite only meeting for a few months, we are starting to see some early impact. New people have steadily attended and, most importantly, regularly returned. We have heard stories of people coming to church for the first time in years after experiencing deep hurts. Others have mentioned our intentionality and love as reasons to continue coming back. We have partnered with Woodglen Elementary School and Food for Hope. Woodglen in particular has embraced us and described themselves as being blown away by Calvary's generosity.

In Thornton there have been six baptisms, 17 new members, connections being formed with community schools and hospitals, double the number of students attending mid-week gatherings, and now over 150 people are calling the Thornton campus their church home, including most of the original memebers from The Gathering. We are currently partnering with two other churches, Woori Church (Korean speaking) and La Familia De Dios (Spanish speaking). We are so thankful for these relationships and look forward to seeing how the Lord uses them for his glory in Thornton.

MINISTRY OPERATIONS ANNUAL REPORT 2020-2021

Communication

A main focus this year was the launch of Calvary's new brand, logo, and visual identity to represent our mission and current vision on digital and print communication channels. The website was updated to resource and engage our community online including a chat function, forms to request help and prayer, and a map tool to connect individuals with HomeGroups. We started sending two to three emails a week to update and encourage the congregation. Two podcasts were created. The Weekly Podcast takes what happened over the weekend and connects it with real life lived Monday through Friday. HomeGroup Heads-Up Podcast helped leaders to prepare for the weekend. Key events such as Easter weekend and Christmas were advertised through our digital platforms. Our social media accounts were filled with consistent, engaging content to connect with our communities and show them what Calvary looks and feels like.

Facilities

The Thornton campus became a reality in this last fiscal year with our closing on April 14, 2020. We were able to pay off the small mortgage on the building given to us by The Gathering Church. The building has been completely updated to enhance Calvary ministries to the Thornton community. In Boulder, we finished extensive restroom rennovations. We also invested in a state-of-the-art air purification system, Needlepoint Bipolar Ionization, at all three campuses.

Staffing

We concentrated on staffing our Thornton campus this last year which included the addition of our Thornton Campus Pastor. Children's ministries in Boulder and Erie have seen a change this year and new staff have been hired to replace those that moved, retired, or needed time with their families. We hired staff to direct Children's Ministries at all three campuses and they have begun to assemble their teams. We also hired a Director of Creative Arts to lead communications and the creative team at all campuses and online. Boulder is currently in search of a new Worship Pastor.

Attendance

We're grateful that many people continue to choose Calvary as their church home. We saw new people attend Calvary online, through HomeGroups, and after regathering in January. Our online services averaged 786 views per week, a mix of HomeGroups, families, and friends watching together, as well as individuals online. From the beginning of 2021 through the end of March our average inperson attendance was 1,104. We also had an average of 609 people join us on the lawns of our three campuses in the summer. God continues to bless our church at all campuses with more people fully devoted to loving God and loving others.

ELDER BOARD REPORT

The Calvary Elder Board exists to provide leadership to our staff and ministries, to provide oversight and vision for the mission of the church, to pray fervently for our staff and those who attend Calvary, to ensure that the church remains biblically true and focused, and to minister to those in our congregation with spiritual and physical needs. The Board meets twice monthly: a shepherding meeting in which we focus on spiritual leadership, prayer and encouragement, and a business meeting designed to attend to the practical running of the church. We strive to provide over-arching, big-picture leadership, and allow the everyday details of ministry to be administrated by the leadership and staff.

As our communities, nation, and world seemed to grind to a halt, the Elder Board, in conjunction with Calvary's Lead Team and staff, led the effort to inaugurate Calvary at Home. It was a robust plan for over a thousand people to meet in HomeGroups each weekend. In December, Calvary regathered for several Evenings of Prayer; times to gather on each campus in-person to pray and worship together. This paved the way for a phased regathering starting in January. We have seen gradually increasing attendance at each of our three campuses, as well as continuing our online services each week. In all, Calvary has seen attendance at our three campuses and online begin to reach pre-COVID levels!

As the Board looks back on this year, God's faithfulness to Calvary is evident. You as a congregation continue to give sacrificially. Our Benevolence Fund has been overfunded! We have been able to bless many families and individuals who have had significant financial needs as a result. You gave over and above the weekly budget needs, including generous giving to the Heart of Advent and the Staff Love Gift at Christmas. We have seen numerous personnel changes this year, the most notable being the addition of Zack Thompson, our new Thornton campus pastor. The Elder Board was able to meet Zack, interview him, and unanimously extend an invitation for him and Emily to join the Calvary family.

The Board initiated a new Leadership Forum last fall to identify, encourage, and develop leadership opportunities at Calvary. From this group emerged three new elder candidates who will be voted on at our annual meeting. We continue to pray fervently for the needs of the church, our congregation, our communities and our world. Prayer and study of God's Word remain foundational elements of our Board meetings. God has blessed the Board with a deep sense of unity, and we feel honored to be called to spiritually lead Calvary, especially over the past year.



















