#### **Worship Services**

This year we studied the books of Thessalonians and Hebrews, explored what it means to go Beyond Blue, and began our series in the book of James.

The online worship service continues to grow in its quality and impact. Our YouTube channel has 809 subscribers, as people watch, worship, and listen to the message during the week. We have expanded our capabilities for recording worship at the Erie Campus and established a studio at the Boulder campus for recording sermons and a wide variety of video content for the ministries of Calvary.

In February, we welcomed Eric Edwardson as the new Director of Worship Arts at the Boulder campus, and he is working to enhance worship

and continue to build the worship team in Boulder. It has been a year of growth in worship and exploration to connect with people in our communities and beyond with the message of Christ.

Incredible volunteer worship leaders have filled in for David Frush while he's been on medical leave. We're so thankful for how people have stepped in to serve, and to support David. Please continue to **5** pray for him, for Susan and their kids, and for healing.

#### **Children's Ministries**

Calvary Kids values teaching the Bible creatively, being Christ-centered, engaging in worship and celebration, growing relationships, full family discipleship, and having fun while staying safe. For Easter in 2021, we held a take-home egg hunt through which 500 families heard the gospel. Kids Week saw families host groups in their own backyards throughout the summer. We launched our new curriculum, Tru, which focuses on the Big God Story, amplifying God as the main character and inviting each child to take part. We enjoyed the Christmas season with the Christmas County Spelling Bee Musical, and an at-home Twelve Days of Christmas family activity. We began 2022 with PJs and cereal, a Valentine's Family Time, and classes on Spiritual Parenting. What an amazing year!

#### **Student Ministry**

All three campuses have been working together to see students grow and mature in Christ and we are grateful for the ways God has worked over the last year in student ministry. We have welcomed four new full-time student ministry staff members this past year. Our team collaborated on teaching series, trips, and ministry values together as Chris and Lindsay brought the new team up to speed on the culture of Calvary's student ministry. We have seen God work as we have been able to resume regular times of getting away together in both middle and high school ministries. We are thankful to have 100 volunteer leaders across our campuses who give their time, talents and energy to making disciples of our students at Calvary.



#### Middle School Ministry

Middle school students from all three campuses met for worship, teaching, small groups and fun. This past summer we returned to worshiping at Maranatha Bible Camp with over 100 students and leaders. In February we were able to gather over 120 Calvary students and leaders with multiple churches from the EFCA Rocky Mountain District for our Winter WKND retreat.

#### **High School Ministry**

This year, high school students met weekly at all three campuses for teaching, worship and small groups. In the summer, 90 of us gathered together for our Getaway Retreat and it was an awesome weekend of coming back after being separated for so long. In addition, over 50 students and leaders got to enjoy seven days of summer Colorado backpacking through the Calvary Wilderness ministry. More than 100 of us enjoyed going to Fall Retreat at Crooked Creek Ranch in September. This spring, over 110 students and leaders experienced the Ironman trip in California. It was an amazing week of meditating on the book of Philippians together, enjoying the beach and building Christ-centered community as a high school ministry.

#### **Adult Classes:**

Weekly classes have covered a diverse range of subjects, from in-depth study of Scripture to special topics related to spiritual growth.

#### Young Adults:

We praise God for the work He is doing in our Young Adults! New groups of young adults have formed this past year and have demonstrated a hunger for relational and spiritual growth. Some have engaged in Basecamp and others in learning how to read and apply Scripture. Overall, they have enriched our church with their energy, pursuit of fellowship, including intergenerational relationships, and participation in service opportunities.

#### LifeGroups:

We celebrate how dedicated men and women from across Calvary have continued to provide love and care for almost 60 LifeGroups following our season of HomeGroups a year ago. These LifeGroups include people from all stages and stations of adult life. Many LifeGroups discuss sermon-related discussion questions, but they also include groups journeying together through Basecamp and other special studies. Every LifeGroup is a biblical community on mission that commits to studying God's Word, caring for each other, and meeting needs of those outside the group.

#### Men's Ministry:

Men from across our three campuses have met regularly to encourage, challenge, and grow together in their faith. Altogether, about 20 groups engaged in ministry together in small groups, mentoring relationships, and Men of Action teams that supply tangible help for people in our church family.

#### Women's Ministry

Women's ministry continues to care for women and encourage them to grow and strengthen their faith. Calvary women gather throughout the week in over 20 Bible Studies, MOPS/MOMSnext, and mentoring ministries groups. Over the year we held special events like reEngage, Christmas brunches on all three campuses, and an annual retreat. The special events give opportunities to build community and celebrate what Christ is doing in our lives. The Thornton campus continues to grow with Bible study groups meeting and multiplying each semester. We are so glad to be together again in small and large groups this year with a new appreciation for our church community.

# EXTERNALLY FOCUSED MINISTRIES ANNUAL REPORT 2021-2022

#### Local Outreach

Our communities have been challenged greatly this year. Calvary has responded with compassion, generosity, and mercy; lifting up, walking-alongside, and bearing the burdens of the suffering.

**Kingdom Assignment - Marshall Fire Fund**: Calvary's members and attendees mobilized to help victims of the Marshall Fire by providing temporary housing, collecting donations, setting up popup-shops, delivering meals, and giving away \$200,000 in direct assistance to over 180 individuals and families impacted by the fire.

**Vaccine Clinics:** Over 1,700 vaccines were administered through CDPHE vaccine clinics hosted on Calvary campuses, increasing trust and visibility within our communities.

**Heart of Advent 2022:** Through the amazing generosity of Calvary members and attendees, over \$200,000 was raised to support STEP Seminary in Haiti and to help Afghan refugees resettle in our communities.

**STEP Seminary:** STEP will be able to provide its seminary students with scholarships, train and care for pastors, and continue to operate amidst Haiti's turmoil.

**Afghan Refugees:** Household items, clothing, furnishings, time, and finances were given to resettle 28 people comprising 3 families. Sponsorship teams continue to walk beside these families as they learn English, move into apartments, enroll children into school, and find employment – essentially beginning a new life.

#### **BOULDER CAMPUS**

We identified four key areas of need in Boulder: affordable housing, at-risk children and families, homelessness, and aging adults. Strategic partnerships were strengthened with Flatirons Habitat for Humanity, University Hill Elementary School, EFAA, the Boulder Safehouse, Boulder Pregnancy Resource Center, Lamb's Lunch, Deacon's Closet, and Brookdale Boulder Creek. Calvary dedicated three Habitat homes, collected 3,260 pounds of food, supported Uni Hill with teacher encouragement, training, academic programs, and mentoring; provided victims of domestic violence with rides to church; prepared and served meals for the homeless; and will be re-launching a Sunday program for seniors in assisted living.

#### **ERIE CAMPUS**

We have continued to care for our neighbors by providing and packing food for Erie kids, shoveling snow for seniors, and inviting neighbors to community events in Erie. We maintain and grow our partnerships with local organizations such as Erie Education Foundation, Erie Uplink, Solo Moms Network, Teachers Who Tutor, and the Town of Erie to be a trusted resource for those in the community.

#### **THORNTON CAMPUS**

We began the process of learning about and investing in our newest community, the city of Thornton. We partnered with organizations like Thornton Community Connections to provide housing and material resources to those in need. During the Christmas season we worked with Perfect Holiday gift to provide meals and gifts to local families. We also established connections with nearby schools, daycares, and housing complexes as we continue to build relationships with our neighbors and local businesses.

# COMMUNITIES ANNUAL REPORT 2021-2022

#### **Global Outreach**

Calvary remains committed to seeing the Gospel go to the ends of the earth by supporting individuals, families, and organizations involved in global ministry. The last two years have presented significant challenges for the global Church and our partners but God has been faithful to lead, direct, and work in the midst of it all.

One of our partners, STEP Seminary in Haiti, has experienced significant challenges due to gang activity and national crises. However, they have remained faithful to serve and train up pastors and leaders in Haiti. This year, Calvary committed to help support the education of three potential future professors at the seminary along with other initiatives. After a long season of limited travel, Calvary is planning to send out two groups this June. One group will be going to Brazil to do medical and evangelistic work on the Amazon river alongside one of our long-time partners, Igreja Presbiteriana de Manaus (Presbyterian Church of Manaus). Likewise, a high school student ministry trip will be going to El Salvador with an organization called Filter of Hope to partner with local churches to distribute water filters and share the Gospel.

By God's grace, our partners continue to spread the Gospel, make disciples, translate the Scriptures, support local churches, and reach some of the hardest to reach places in the world! We are committed to Christ's call to make disciples of all nations by supporting our partners, praying, and raising up people to go out from our church to unreached peoples (Matt. 28:18-20).


# MINISTRY OPERATIONS ANNUAL REPORT 2021-2022

#### Communications

The Communications Team helps our internal ministries communicate Calvary's vision and mission and supports each with planning, designing, printing, promotion, video production, and many other services. The Comms Team also helps reach external audiences that don't yet know Jesus or Calvary through social media, advertising, the website and more!

This year we continued to send the midweek update email to encourage and inform the congregation. The two podcasts kept gaining listeners and continue to thrive. Once we resumed in-person services, the online service maintained over 300 weekly viewers and we now have 809 subscribers to our Calvary Bible Church YouTube Channel!

It was a joy to have in-person Christmas services again, and we advertised all the special services online and through direct mail (Carols & Campfires, Christmas Eve, and a special online only Christmas Day message).



#### Staffing

We welcomed a new director of worship arts at the Boulder Campus. In the past year we hired four youth ministry staff. We hired a facilities manager to oversee all three campuses. The Erie campus had been looking for a children's ministry lead and we now have that position filled as of May 1st.

#### Facilities

A major project this last year was to build and equip a studio for our online and video ministry. Looking at our 43-year-old facility in Boulder, we have concentrated efforts for this campus. We contracted to have all the HVAC units replaced and upgraded to meet the Boulder Energy Initiative. Boulder also hosted a successful landscaping work-day in October with over 50 volunteers. We certainly cannot forget the roof in Boulder blowing off and landing on the east sidewalk during the wind storm that caused the Marshall fire. The roof has been successfully replaced and upgraded to code.

#### Attendance

We have seen a steady return to in-person services and an amazing number of new families joining each campus. Our average weekly attendance at all three campuses in 2021 was 1,456. Easter and Christmas Eve also had an increase from the 2020 COVID year with 2,094 and 2,617 attendees respectively.


