Week 5 Discussion Questions

Text: John 3:22-36

Icebreaker: Who is someone in your life that you look up to in your faith? In what ways has their faith inspired or encouraged your own?

- 1. Read this week's passage. What stands out from the text or sermon?
- 2. John the Baptist is referred to as "Rabbi" by his disciples in this text. To be a Rabbi in the ancient world was a high honor. John the Baptist is a man of prominent place with significant authority. His disciples expect that John would be threatened by the presence of a competing Rabbi down the river. Why is John not threatened by Jesus' presence?
- 3. "Always the bridesmaid, never the bride" is a phrase usually associated with shame, sadness, and longing as the forever bridesmaid yearns for a turn to be the bride. How does John describe his role as the friend of the bridegroom?
- 4. How would you describe your own attitude concerning sharing what Christ has done in your life with others?
- 5. How you think the broader culture would define living a successful life in our world today.
- 6. What character traits does the broader culture seem to value in a person according to that definition of success?
- 7. What does John mean by the phrase "He must increase, but I must decrease" and in what way does applying it to your own life shape how you define success?
- 8. John 3:36 has two parallel statements which identifies *belief* with *obedience*. What does it mean that John uses these words synonymously and how does one impact the other?
